

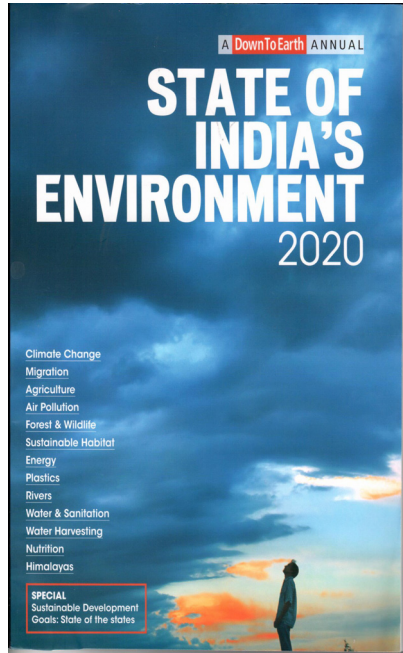
Disaster Risks and Environment Nexus in India
